The largest LGBTQ+ global inclusion conference in education.

Now it its 3rd edition, Pride in Education is rapidly establishing itself as the one stop shop for practical tips and resources for everyone interested being more inclusive of diverse sexual orientation, gender identities and expressions in education.

Supported by Sir Derek Jacobi CBE, Bonnie Greer OBE and over 80 community partners, it will run from 11 to 13 June 2021 virtually on zoom. We hope to replicate the success of past events by attracting 15,000 delegates over three days.

With 48 contributors from 4 continents it offers knowledge sharing panels, workshops and presentations to equip practitioners with the tools they need to be more inclusive in and out of schools.

Over the last year we have received over 700 individuals and organisational pledges to be more inclusive in schools, colleges and universities around the world. in 2020 we educated over 3000 people through two 1-day events.


Individual pledges

- take my learning to our leadership team to try to make the organisation a better ally


Organisational pledges
